


# Genesis 3:14-24

- 3) In verse 15, what does God mean by "And I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will crush your head, and you will strike his heel?"


Redemption



How is this covenant tied to the covenant of Creation?


The covenant of Redemption is God's response to the breaking of his original covenant with Man. The same ordinances of the creation covenant appear in this one, but they now carry a curse. Only through God's redemptive plan can this curse be overturned.


What is the significance of the order of the blessings and curses (first the serpent, 2nd Eve, and 3rd Adam)?







- Romans 16:20



How does God ratify this covenant?

The sign and seal of this covenant is the covering of our shame with clothing. In order to provide these clothes, the blood of animals had to be shed. This is the first act of substitutionary atonement described in the Bible.
