


Group Questions


- 1) Compare this covenant with the previous ones we've studied. What are the similarities and differences?
- 2) Are there any ordinances or signs for this covenant? If so, what are they?
- 3) What role does the prophet play in this covenant? See 2 Kings 2:19-22, 2 Kings 4:42-44, 2 Kings 6:15-18

Look at the genealogy from Ruth chapter 4. Is there anything significant that stands out to you about the relationship of Boaz to Judah and from David to Boaz?


- Judah was like Elemilech. He fled to Canaan after enslaving his brother Joseph, and had wicked sons who married Canaanite women - 2 of which were taken by God.
- Judah unwittingly redeems Tamar with Perez when she posed as a temple prostitute.

Compare this covenant with the previous ones we've studied. What are the similarities and differences?

- There is a promise of relationship, but it is to an individual instead of a people.
- There is Sabbath rest, but it is a rest from his enemies.
- The promise is tied to his seed - the son of David was the same as the seed of Abraham and of the woman.



Are there any ordinances or signs for this covenant? If so, what are they?


The sign of this covenant is the throne. So long as God has a son of David on the throne, we know He keeps His promises.

There aren't any specific ordinances stated other than when a son of David does "wrong", he'd be punished with the rod of men. Implied in this is the keeping of the law of Moses.



What role does the prophet play in this covenant? See 2 Kings 2:19-22, 2 Kings 4:42-44, 2 Kings 6:15-18

Samuel was the last judge and the first prophet. The prophets served as mediators to the sons of David and performed signs that reminiscent of Jesus. Unfortunately, as kings became estranged from God, their voice was ignored and eventually stomped out from the time of Malachi to the time of Christ.
